UNIVERSITY COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

8:30 a.m. The Liacouras Center, at 1776 N. Broad St., opens for Commencement guests.

Tickets are required for all guests to enter. Graduating students must request

tickets in advance. Graduates do not need tickets.

8:30–8:45 a.m. All graduates report in academic regalia. Meet up with some of Temple's exciting

performers positioned at a few special points on campus to point you toward The Liacouras Center. Students will line up in The Liacouras Center loading dock for the graduate procession into the arena. Graduates must wear regalia to walk.

9:25 a.m. Procession of graduates begins for Temple University's 137th Commencement.

9:40 a.m. Faculty and stage party procession begins.

10 a.m. Temple University's 137th Commencement ceremony begins with President

Englert's welcome. The ceremony will last approximately 90 minutes.

THE LIACOURAS CENTER SAFETY AND SECURITY

Please note that walkthrough metal detectors will be in use at the university Commencement ceremony and all school and college ceremonies at The Liacouras Center. Large bags and backpacks are also not permitted, and a clear bag policy will be in effect. For additional information, <u>read this document</u>. Bags will also be searched, so we kindly request that guests limit their bags to small clutch-sized and/or plastic or clear bags to expedite entry. Backpacks and/or large bags, **balloons**, **air horns**, **selfie sticks**, **signs and confetti are not permitted in The Liacouras Center or any of the buildings where school/college ceremonies are held**. Flowers and other gifts for graduates can be purchased inside The Liacouras Center and at selected venues.

ACCESSIBLE SEATING

- The Liacouras Center: Access ramps at all entrances and seating areas to accommodate all guests.
- Temple Performing Arts Center: Wheelchair-accessible entrance on the north side of the venue at the corner of Broad Street and Polett Walk; wheelchair-accessible seat locations are available throughout Lew Klein Hall and the Chapel of Four Chaplains.
- The Kimmel Center and the Academy of Music: All theaters have wheelchair-accessible locations
 including stair-free access and either open space to accommodate a variety of mobility devices, or
 an upholstered loose chair can be provided.

COMMENCEMENT STREAM AND BROADCAST

PARKING

Students received assigned parking passes for themselves and their guests, which are required to enter the parking lots. The Liacouras Center and 15th Street lots are only available to those with parking passes for those locations. Please refer to your parking ticket for your assigned parking lot. If you plan to leave campus between ceremonies and return the same day, we strongly suggest that you use public transportation or taxis. If you leave a parking lot, you may have difficulty getting back into the same lot. Please allow plenty of time as Commencement is a busy day on campus.

SEPTA's northbound and southbound subway stops are at the intersection of Broad Street and Cecil B. Moore Avenue. Subway fare is \$2.50 one way. Stations offer single-use, one-way passes that can be purchased with cash or debit/credit card, and SEPTA Key allows you to take multiple rides. SEPTA Key card holders can utilize the <u>multirider feature</u> that allows up to five riders on one SEPTA key card. Regional Rail lines stop at Temple University Station at 10th and Berks streets. Fares for Regional Rail may vary.

ETIQUETTE

Commencement is a celebration of our students' accomplishments and a formal academic event conducted with dignity and decorum. During the ceremony, please remain in your seats and refrain from blocking aisles and walkways, including the area directly in front of the stage. Kindly silence or turn off cellphones.

Backpacks and/or large bags, balloons, air horns, selfie sticks, signs and confetti are not permitted in The Liacouras Center or any of the buildings where school/college ceremonies are held. Flowers and other gifts for graduates can be purchased inside The Liacouras Center and at selected venues.

REGALIA

Bachelor's degree candidates should wear their mortarboard, so it sits parallel with the ground, with the tassel hanging to the right. Graduates often decorate their mortarboards in a fun and celebratory fashion. Creativity and expression are encouraged. During the ceremony, the university president will ask graduates to move their tassels from the right front side of the mortarboard to the left to officially mark the awarding of degrees. Master's and doctoral candidates should wear caps with tassels attached to the left.

Commencement regalia does not have to be returned after the ceremonies. It can be kept as a keepsake or responsibly recycled.

Graduates who have met academic criteria are eligible to wear cords representative of Latin honors, university honors and other distinctive academic honor programs and societies. If graduates were unable to pick up their honor cords at their school or college or the university Commencement on the ground level of Sullivan Hall they can contact the Strategic University Events Office at commencement@temple.edu.
